### **District Developments**

During the 21/22 school year, the Princeton School District formed the Continuous Improvement Team (CIT). The purpose of this committee is to examine student achievement results and evaluate curriculum and educational practices in an effort to improve reading and math achievement. The CIT is made up of Princeton administrators, teachers, and CESA 5 curriculum and technology specialists. Over the course of the 21/22 school year, the committee examined Princeton's School Report Card and gathered information about the curriculum resources being used across the district. The team prioritized district needs and has identified both short and long-term goals. Planning for the 22/23 teacher in-service days is already taking place. Next year, teachers will focus on identifying essential standards and evaluating grading practices to assure grades reflect proficiency with the learning standards. The district has plans to extend reading and math intervention services to the high school level. Students who are demonstrating delays in reading and math will receive targeted instruction focused on their individual needs. We are excited about the positive strides our district is making to better serve our students. It is through continued examination, reflection, and change that we will create tomorrow's citizens and leaders.

Foods and Restaurant Students Attend Expo in Green Bay!



Deciding on a career is difficult. At Princeton High School, the administration, guidance counselor, and teachers work hard to provide connections for students to engage in events and visit workplaces to find opportunities for their future. Students from the Foods and Restaurant Classes attended a ProStart Career and Industry Expo on April 12 at Lambeau Field in Green Bay. This expo combined a behind-the-scenes tour of venue operations with career exploration and job readiness skills for students who might contemplate entering the hospitality industry.

They began their day touring Lambeau Field guided by representatives from Delaware North, the food service provider for the Green Bay Packers. They saw the inner workings of the food service and beverage industry in the stadium and were able to ask questions of the representative. They asked such thoughtful questions that the representative gave them a private tour of the game-day field suites.

Next, the students watched a demonstration by Chef Ace Champion, a professional chef who graduated from Fox Valley Technical College. Chef Champion is well known in the Green Bay area and specializes in Cajun/Creole cooking. He shared his passion for infusing flavor into food and sharing it with others. One of our PHS students was invited to take part in the demo. Her knife skills were awesome!

After a lunch provided by Culvers and Gordon Food Service, the students visited booths with representatives from food service companies across the state who are looking for applicants. Some of the employers included: Titletown, Pepsi Co., Al Johnson's of Door County, Cousins Subs, Kohler, and Stone Cellar of Appleton. The day wrapped up with a short workshop from NWTC of Green Bay which focused on developing their resume writing skills and broadening their opportunities. All in all, it was a wonderful day full of great camaraderie and learning.









# Agriculture and Technical Education

The 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Band had their first ever performance in December and performed again just this past week at the May Concert. They are learning to listen to each other and not just play on their own. Part of being in band is working as a team to make the performance the best it can be.

Middle and High School Band Students have gotten back into their regular routine, including in-person solo and ensemble and concert festivals. In April when the bands performed for judges over in Pardeeville, both groups received a rating of a 1<sup>st</sup>. It was fun to be able to work with the judges in person and get feedback from them. It was also nice to go over to Pardeeville and play in their new auditorium.

Our Solo & Ensemble Festivals were also a success. The middle and high school students earned 110 gold and silver medals! We also had a handful of events qualify for the State Festival; Amber Mans-French Horn Solo, Maddy Cody-Alto Saxophone Solo, Julianna Fishbaugher-Clarinet Solo, Elizabeth Bornick-Vocal Solo and the High School Clarinet Choir. These entries earned another 18 gold and silver medals at the state level!

The concert season ends in May for 5th Grade Band and Middle School, but our High School Band still has a few events to go. After the concert on May 16<sup>th</sup>, they will have a Band Awards night on Wednesday, May 25<sup>th</sup>, the Graduation Ceremony on Sunday May 29<sup>th</sup> and the Memorial Day Program on Monday, May 30<sup>th</sup>.
